

SANDHILL RIVER WATERSHED DISTRICT

July 10, 1950

The Board of Directors of the Sand Hill River Drainage and Conservancy District met at Crookston, Minnesota, on July 10, 1950.

All directors were present.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Ole G. Olson, and requested the secretary to read the minutes of the meeting held on June 19, 1950. There being no omissions or corrections, the president approved the minutes as read.

The directors met with their attorney, W.E. Rowe, at his office in the city of Crookston, for the purpose of discussing means to raise money for the repair of washouts in the Sand Hill River.

Mr. Rowe advised the directors that until a Tax District had been established and some improvements made, the board had no power to do any repairing. He referred the directors to the County Board of Polk County and the County Board would not make any repairs unless a petition was presented to them. If such a petition were presented then an assessment would have to be made against the original real estate to pay for the repairs. The directors decided not to present such a petition because only the original property would be assessed, and not all of the property in the entire district.

There being no further business, motion made by Martin Braaten and seconded by Charlie Sheridan to adjourn. Motion carried and the president declared the meeting duly adjourned.
