The Board of Directors of the Sand Hill River Drainage and Conservancy District met at the N. J. Mjelde house in the village of Beltrami, Minnesota on the 29th day of September, 1955; all directors were present.

The meeting was called to order by the president, Charles L. Sheridan, and he requested the secretary to read the minutes of the last meeting of August 19, 1955, as these were no additions of corrections, same were approved as read.

The meeting was called for the purpose of arranging with Mr. Robert Erickson, engineer from Minneapolis, Minnesota, for plans and cost estimates on new bridges over the Sand Hill River; also for extensions on existing bridges. Preparatory to asking for bids on same in November, 1955, the board, together with Mr. Erik son and Mr. Rood-engineer-then went to see and inspect all bridges over the Sand Hill River. Decided to ask for alternate bid on bridge S-10. The same was a motion included by Martin Braaten and seconded by Henry Nolte that bids call for all new bridges. N. J. Mjelde was instructed to find out, if possible, what length pilings had been used on bridge S-12.

At this meeting, it was agreed to allow Charles Sheridan and Martin Braaten for the time they spent on September 15th, arranging with Omar Rood for Robert Erickson-engineer-to come and meet with the board and draw plans on bridges.

N. J. Mjelde was asked to go and inspect culverts through Scandia River together with Omar Rood.
