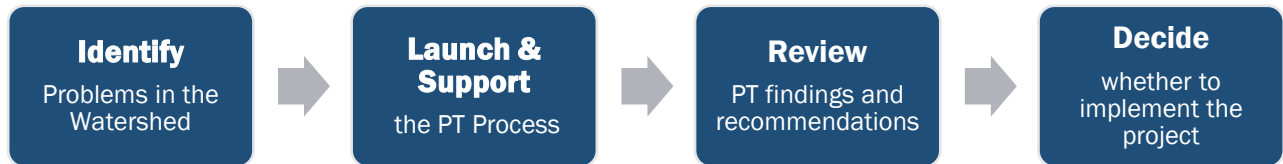


# Project Teams

## Expectations of the Watershed District Board of Managers

- Identify the area of concern
- Assemble a Project Team
- Fiscal responsibility
- Respect the division of duties between the Project Team and SHRWD Board of Managers
- Mindfully allow the Project Team to work through the process
- Review the recommendation from the Project Team and decide whether to implement the project

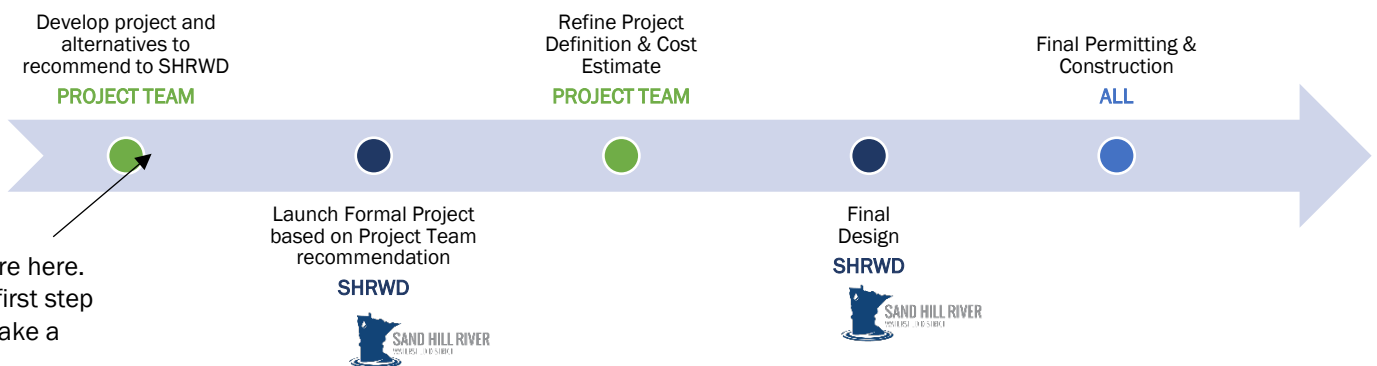
## Expectations of the Watershed District Administrator

- Ensure SHRWD Board of Manager expectations are communicated to the Project Team
- Communication liaison between SHRWD Board of Managers and Project Team (point of contact)
- Oversee work products developed by technical staff

## Expectations of the Project Team

- Respect the division of duties between the Project Team and SHRWD Board of Managers
- Learn about problems and opportunities in the assigned area
- Determine information needed to develop solutions
- Investigate alternative solutions; and seek a single, well-defined alternative to recommend to the SHRWD Board of Managers
- Understand how the project can meet regulatory/permitting requirements
- Discuss and provide recommendations for how the project will be operated
